Enrollment is steadily increasing over time. This is due in part to increased recruitment, and advertisement of the program. One of the most helpful techniques we have used has been collaborations amongst all entities of our public safety division. Due to the regulations of the state for many public safety certifications, several programs require potential students to be 20 or 21 to begin. As such, we encourage graduating high school students to earn their two-year degree in either emergency management or criminal justice while they are in limbo waiting to be eligible for other programs such as BLET, EMS, and Fire Academy. This helps with our enrollment, while also giving the student a leg up before they even begin their other programs. Going forward I will continue focusing on informing people about the program, as well as ensuring graduate satisfaction by following up with the students, ensuring that they have been armed with the skills necessary to be successful in their careers.
