■ **Smithfield Foods** and WCC welcomed a second cohort of maintenance apprentices in a signing ceremony on Sept. 16. The two launched the program last September with 11 apprentices. The new cohort adds 14 apprentices, a mix of individuals already working for Smithfield and some hired specifically to join the apprenticeship program, who are getting on the job training in Smithfield plants and earning associate degrees in Industrial Systems Technology at WCC.



■ WCC has earned an American Association of Community Colleges 2020 **Award of Excellence** in the “student success” category. The student success practice for which WCC was recognized is its CAPPS (Clearing

a Path to Student Success) initiative. CAPSS embraces a “guided pathways” approach to supporting students as they progress to completion. Faculty and staff were involved in the redesign of academic programs and student support services. Those

The **Ash Building**, the new 34,600-square-foot home of WCC's automotive and collision repair programs, opened on schedule for fall classes. Its completion was celebrated with a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Aug. 24. The construction project served as a model for the NC Community College System as WCC was the first of the 58 member institutions to pursue the design-build delivery method in conjunction with State Construction Office oversight.
